In-Class Activities:

Homework:

Homework will be assigned regularly and will be posted on our class website on the class calendar. Homework assignments will be checked regularly for completion. If an assignment is only partially complete you may receive partial credit that day. If an assignment is incomplete the day it is due you have until the end of the unit on test day to turn in the assignment for half credit. Homework assignments not turned in before the end of the unit on test day will receive a zero.

Quizzes:

Quizzes will take place throughout the chapters. The quiz's point value will vary depending on the amount of material the quiz covers. Quizzes will be announced and posted on the class website calendar.

Tests:

Tests will take place at the end of a chapter or unit. Tests will be announced in advance and posted on our class website on the calendar for your grade. Review material will be done in class for every test but will also be expected to be reviewed at home as well.

Daily Routine

Beginning of Class:

1. Check mailbox
2. Check for any handouts
3. Get out materials and homework that is due
4. Write down your assigned homework in your agenda
5. Begin POD (problem of the day)
6. Wait **quietly** for class to begin

Absent:

You are responsible for making up any work that you miss including in-class notes. You should see me if you have any questions about the work you need to make up.
